

NBN Trust Business Plan 2017-18

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1. Introduction

This business plan describes the delivery against our Strategy 2015 – 2020 pursuing our vision that *Biological data collected and shared openly by the Network are central to the UK's learning and understanding of its biodiversity and are critical to all decision making about nature and the environment* for the year 2017-18.

This plan will set out the current staffing and financial situation and the key points from the Action Plan which will be the main focus for the NBN Trust for this year.

2. Staffing

The budget proposed for 2017-18 maintains the core permanent staff of CEO, Finance and Business Officer and Senior Communications Officer, along with four posts that are currently on fixed term contracts. These are the Scottish Liaison Officer, Project Development Officer, Membership and Business Development Officer and Communications Officer. The budget also includes two additional fixed term contract posts, a Technical and Data Support Officer and a Systems Developer (totalling 7.3 FTE), both of which will hopefully be in post by the end of July.

3. Funding Summary

5. Action Plan Priorities

The NBN Action Plan 2016-2020 sets out the commitment the NBN Trust members and data partners will make to delivering the NBN Strategy 2015 – 2020. The Action Plan has 21 objectives and 95 actions that should be implemented to achieve the Network's vision. This section sets out which actions will be the priorities in 2017-18. Details on priorities for future years are in Appendix A.

The actions can be split into those that require a 'one -off' review or implementation and those which are critical, but 'business as usual' ongoing work streams without a finite end to the action. These are set out in table 3 and 4 respectively.
