Estimating **R**oadkill

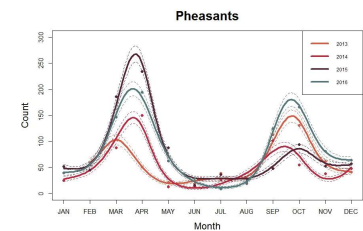
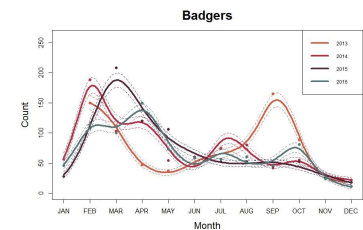
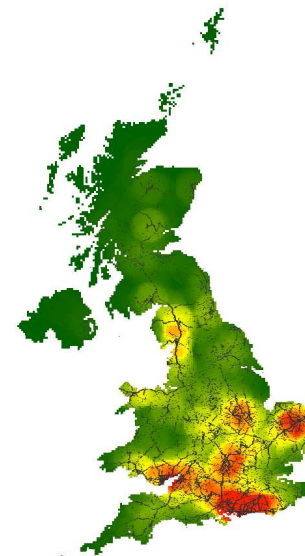
**30,000+ records** received since 2013.

## Project aims

1. Quantify UK wildlife roadkill reported by the public using social media.
2. Determine which species are most frequently observed
3. Identify spatial and temporal hotspots of roadkill
4. Ultimately reduce the impact of roads on our UK wildlife

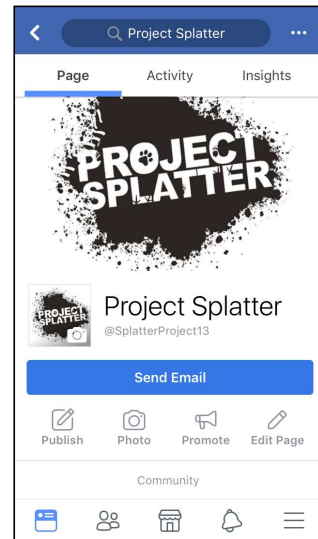

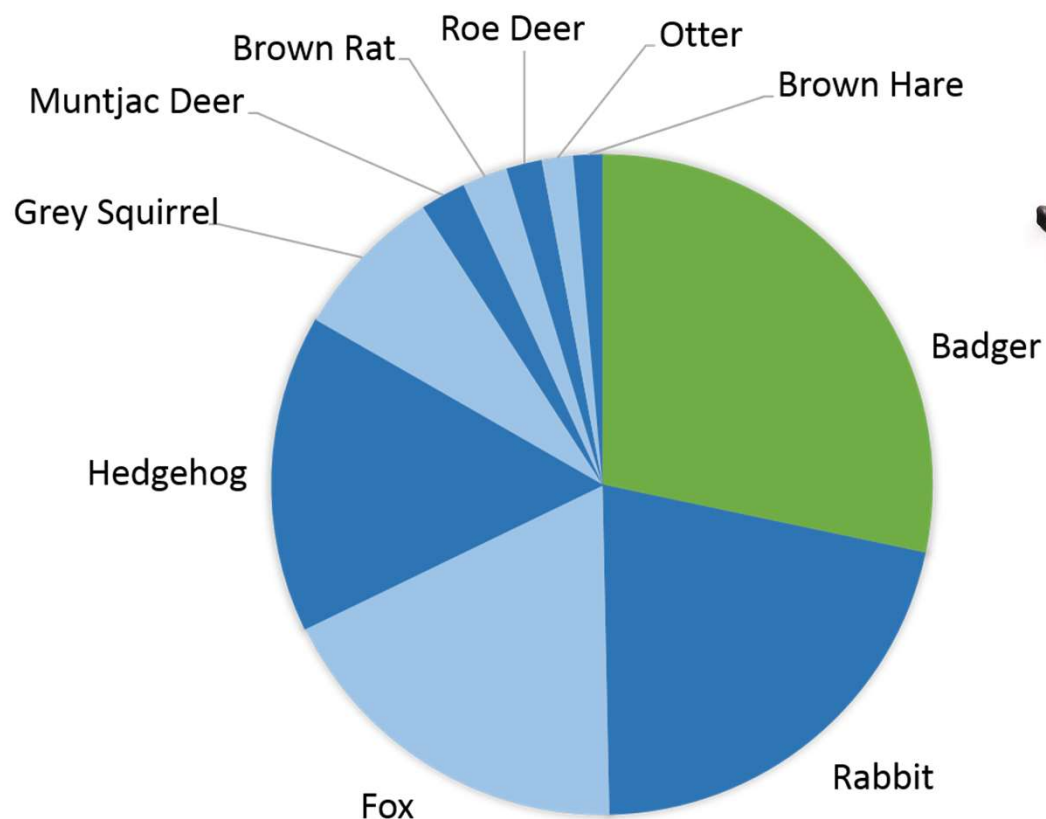
**What information do we ask for?**

- Species of animal (as accurate as possible)
- Location
- Date
- Any other supplementary information if known, i.e. age/sex of animal

## Top 10 mammals

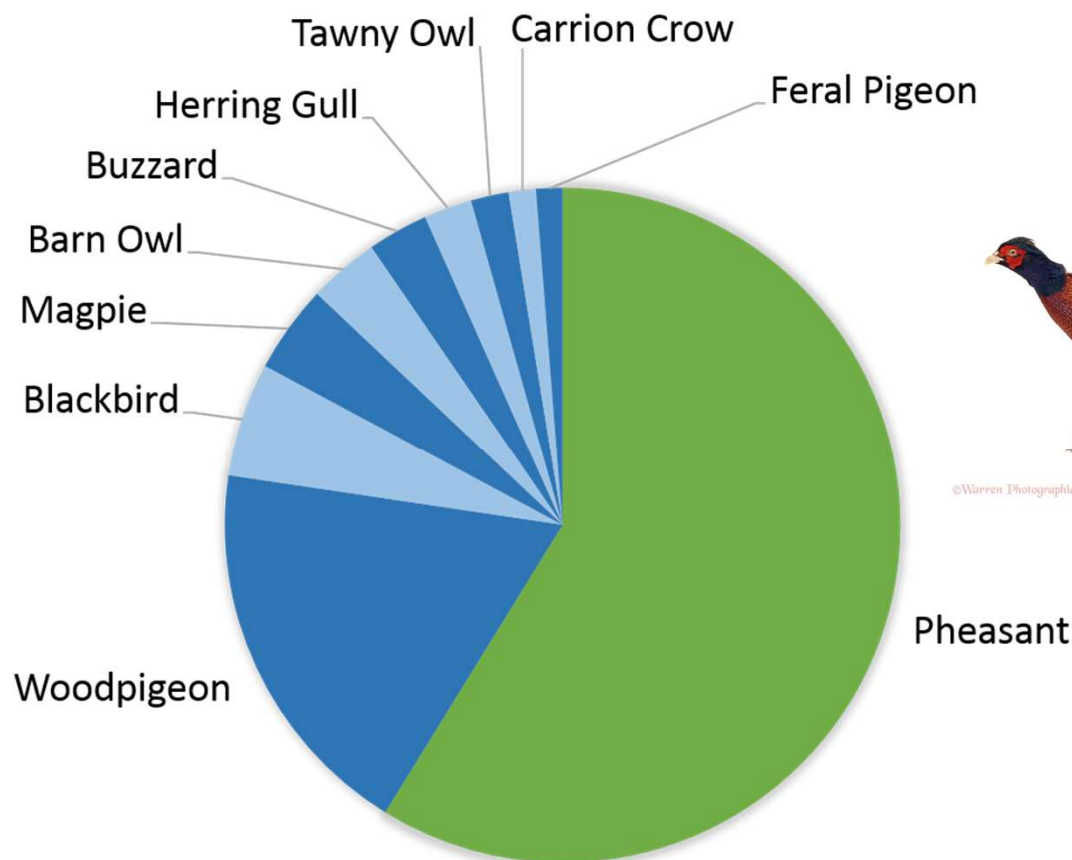
1. Badger **28%**
2. Rabbit **21%**
3. Fox **18%**
4. Hedgehog **16%**
5. Grey Squirrel **8%**
6. Muntjac Deer **2%**
7. Brown Rat **2%**
8. Roe Deer **2%**
9. Otter **2%**
10. Brown Hare **1%**

## Top 10 birds

1. Pheasant **59%**
2. Woodpigeon **19%**
3. Blackbird **6%**
4. Magpie **4%**
5. Barn Owl **3%**
6. Buzzard **3%**
7. Herring Gull **2%**
8. Tawny Owl **2%**
9. Carrion Crow **1%**
10. Feral Pigeon **1%**



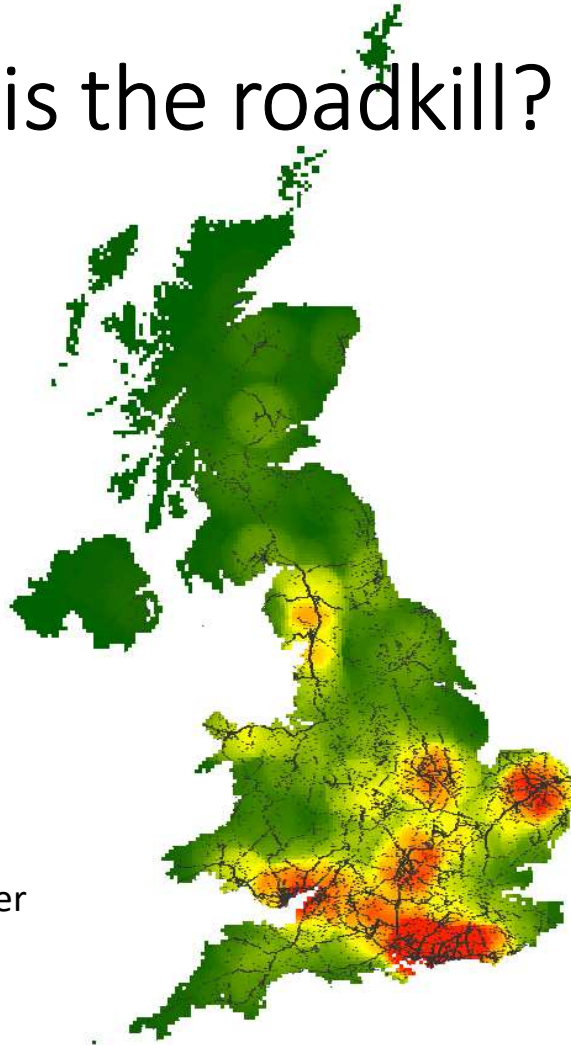

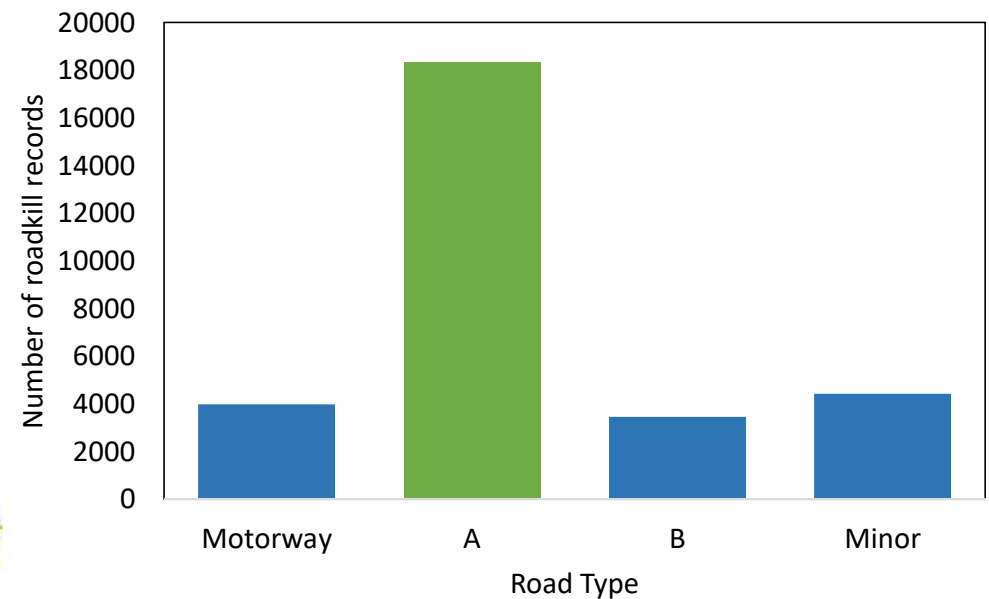
# Where is the roadkill?

over the UK!

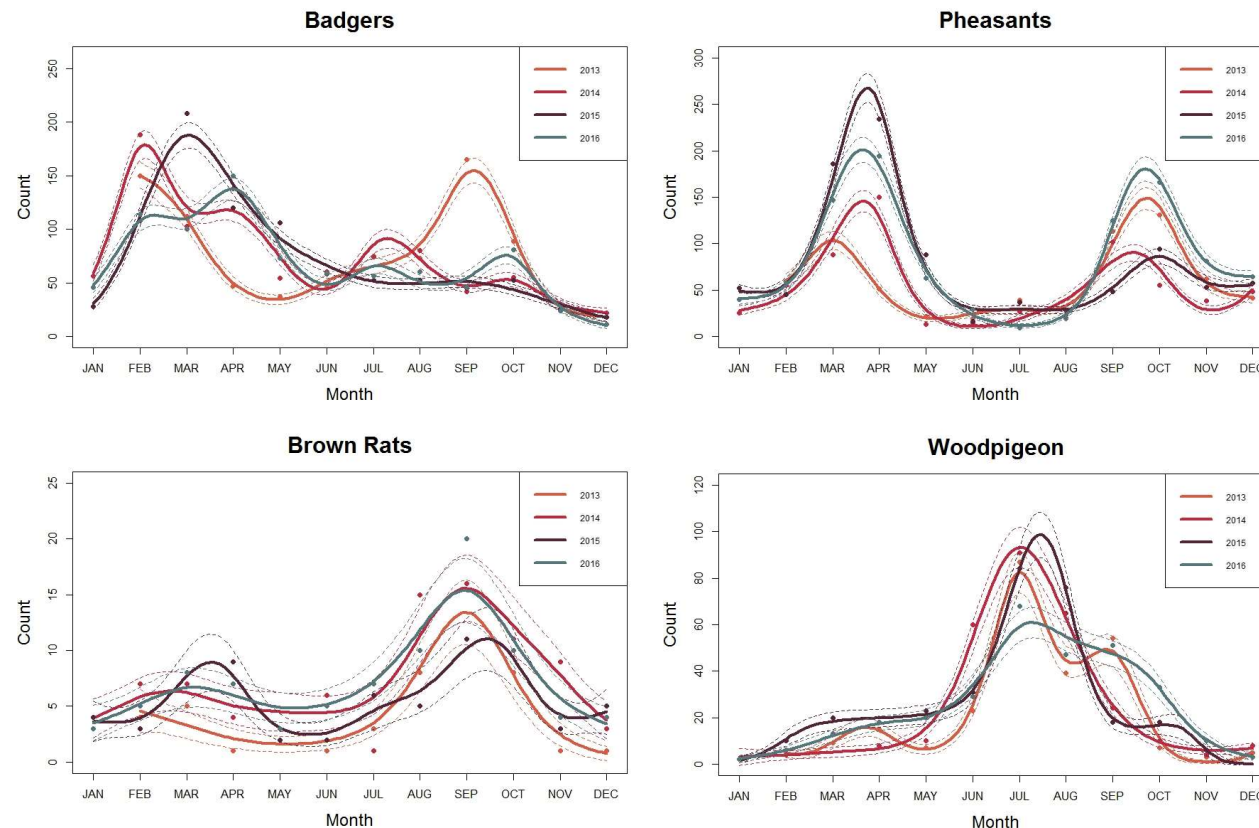
Red = high number
