What is Project Splatter?


Social media PLATform for Estimating Roadkill

30,000+ records received since 2013.

Project aims

- 1. Quantify UK wildlife roadkill reported by the public using social media.
- 2. Determine which species are most frequently observed
- 3. Identify spatial and temporal hotspots of roadkill
- 4. Ultimately reduce the impact of roads on our UK wildlife





What information do we ask for?


- Species of animal (as accurate as possible)

Which mammals are reported as roadkill?




Which birds are reported as roadkill?


