1. Minutes and matters arising from the last meeting (15/03/2018)

All actions carried forward relate to the Review and are listed in section 2 in the minutes below.

2. Update on the Review of the Biological Recording Infrastructure

EW presented an update on the Review and focussed in on progress with defining options (in section 6) and scenarios for the detailed business case. A detailed discussion followed and the key points, revised timeline and actions relating to the Review are listed below.

Key points to inform the business case and recommendations:

- Under Governance a definition of 'autonomy' needs to be included
- The elements of the infrastructure that are common across the UK need to be defined
- Scotland would like to be able to develop their part of the shared infrastructure without being held up by discussions and decisions elsewhere in the UK
- The section on National Outcomes needs to be given a higher priority
- The 'Value of Benefits by Worth' diagram is useful and a headline figure from it could be brought forward in the paper
- Some text on the costs associated with an inadequate infrastructure should be included
- Concern was expressed that the descriptions in the draft scenarios are not ambitious enough

Revised timeline for Recommendations paper

- In the next two weeks: a basic draft will be available
- During May: comments will be sought (including at the next Advisory Group meeting)
- June: re-group to check-in on latest version
- July: release of the paper

Actions carried forward:

NBN Atlas User Group / Community for Scotland

There was some general discussion about the need to increase support for the NBN Atlas in Scotland. It was agreed that a user group for Scotland could be helpful but that expectations for the group would need to be managed. It is envisioned the group could be a community group that would share knowledge and experience of using the Atlas. It would be additional to the Scottish Atlas steering group (which determines development and policies) although it would be helpful to have some users attending the steering group.

A new NBN Stakeholder group is currently being formed and it was explained that this group is a strategic group to support the NBN as a whole, not just the Atlases.

NBN Atlas Scotland Stakeholder Engagement Day - update

The engagement day will take place at Battleby Conference Centre on the 21st June. Help is required to support the day, including: speakers for talks on using the Atlas; facilitators to run the group discussions; and a chair for the event. If you can offer to help or have suggestions for who to approach, please let Christine know.

The Data Lab MSc Innovation Week

The Data Lab's Joshua Ryan-Saha is running an event in the first week of June for MSc students across Scotland to work on solving problems using data. JJ and EW have discussed with him a possible project around tracking data use and returning feedback to the data contributors.
