The majority of action priorities for 2018/19 are on track. Three actions are currently showing as amber:

- Improve data interrogation and visualisation tools Some progress has been made via the stakeholder workshops, however, specific events have not yet been scheduled.
- Stakeholder workshops Workshops in England and Northern Ireland not yet taken place. A workshop on the NBN Atlas will be held at the NBN Conference in November which will allow more people to provide their input. Suggestions from the Scottish and welsh events have been compiled and prioritised

Progress on these two actions has been hampered by not replacing the projects officer who left in July and another member of staff being on sick leave for 3 months (August – October).

• Development and implementation of customisable user pages – this action has been given a reduced priority and will completed early inn 2019/20.

6. Matters for noting

a) CC-BY-NC dispute

The NBN Trust has set a precedent by providing a ruling on a dispute over whether a use was commercial or not for the first time. As agreed with the board we have taken the decision that contractors who were employed by a government agency (in this case APHA) using data from the NBN Atlas is a commercial use, as they are obtaining monetary compensation for doing so. As a result of this our guidance has been updated to reflect that if anyone is obtaining monetary gain from the use of CC-BY-NC data that is commercial use, even if the end use/product is not for profit.

b) SBIF Review update

The business case has now been submitted to the Scottish Government. A SBIF Development Officer has been appointed on a six-month contract to progress the implementation plan and provide advocacy.
