






The NBN Trust's new Strategy

Citizen science is recognised and supported as the major source of biodiversity data.


- Providing a voice for biodiversity citizen science

The National Biodiversity Network is a well-connected and highly collaborative community with a united voice on key issues.


- Expanding the NBN, targeting strategic gaps


Pathway: Connecting species data flows in England
